You will need:

- cream cheese
- icing sugar
- fruit (of your choice)
- butter
- digestives (plain)
- zip lock bags
- cupcake cases



Method:

1. Place 1 biscuit in a zip lock bag and crush up the biscuit.
2. Once you have your crushed up biscuit, add half a teaspoon of butter and mix it together.
3. Now put the mixture to one side. Take 2 table-spoons of cream cheese and 1 teaspoon of icing sugar and stir it together.
4. Next, take your mixture of crushed up biscuits and butter, and put it in your cupcake case.
5. Add your cream cheese and icing sugar on top of the crushed biscuit.
6. Finally, add your fruit on top and enjoy your tasty treat.
